


Kenya's Automotive Industry

Kenya's GDP per capita is expected to reach US\$1,432 by the end of 2015 and to grow at a CAGR of 7.5% between till 2020. This is expected to result in an increase in private consumption and amongst other things, drive the sales of motor vehicles. Expenditure on the purchase of cars, motorcycles and other vehicles accounted for 1.5% of total consumer expenditure in 2015 and is expected to remain relatively stable to 2025 as incomes rise.

The volume of imported cars and motorcycles has been on the increase due to the availability of attractive credit

from financial institutions and the rise of the middle class. According to the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS) the volume of imported vehicles between 2003 and 2012 have grown at over 300% from 33,000 units to 110,474 units. Passenger vehicles were Kenya's fourth largest import overall in 2015, valued at approximately US\$440 million and making up 2.4% of total imports (by value) while commercial vehicles ranked seventh, valued at US\$380 million. If the current trend of 10% to 12% growth per annum on vehicle imports is to be maintained, Kenya will have five million vehicles on the road by the year 2030.
